## **Give Me This Mountain**

Joshua 14: 6-15

1. The battle examined in the sermon is "winning the nations for Jesus." Progress has been made, but the toughest part of the job remains. Why do you think the battle is not yet won?

(Reminder: Unreached people groups are NOT the low hanging fruit.)

- 2. What is your personal version of "watching cartoons"? Is this a serious problem? Could it become one? What can you do about it? Can this group help?
- 3. When are you most likely to feel like a grasshopper? (Numbers 13:33) Why?
- 4. Caleb was 85 years old when he asked for "his mountain." What attributes of Caleb do you admire? What is Caleb's view of God?
- 5. Where does the battle -- winning the nations for Jesus -- begin? (prayer)
- 6. Jesus said, "If you love me, keep my commandments." (JN 14:15) He also said, "Go and make disciples of all the nations..." (MT 28:19) Is this a commandment? What does it mean to go?
- 7. Jesus gave His life for the nations. He knew His role and was obedient to the Father. How can you identify, affirm, and live out your role in winning the nations for Jesus? Is there a mountain you should be asking for?
- 8. Was there a particular point or principle in the sermon that specifically spoke to your heart?
